





# GAP INVESTMENT SHARE IN TÜRKİYE (%)
















# DISSEMINATION OF PRECISION FARMING AND SUSTAINABLE IMPLEMENTATIONS IN GAP REGION

Within the framework of sustainable agricultural techniques, to make the best use of the agricultural potential and to increase the income level of the producers.



#### **DEVELOPMENT OF LIVESTOCK PROJECT**

It is aimed to eliminate the infrastructure deficiencies of the breeders who make their living from animal husbandry in the rural areas within the scope of the development of animal husbandry. With this purpose, Supporting the Infrastructure of Livestock;

- Multi-partner projects, producer organizations, (Producer Unions,
   Cooperatives, Chambers of Agriculture, etc.)
- Projects that take into account capacity development, value chain creation and clustering approaches,
- Sustainable, repeatable and reproducible projects that support the use of technology in the livestock sector,
- ❖ 22 projects were supported, including the year of 2022. 14 projects have been completed and 8 are still ongoing within the scope of the Livestock Development Project.







#### GAP AGRICULTURAL TRAINING & DISSEMINATION PROJECT (GAP TEYAP)

It was put into practice in 2011 to increase the effectiveness of education extension services, especially in the areas opened and to be opened for irrigation in the GAP Region, and to show how the GAP service in this regard can be closed in the future, to be carried out in cooperation with the relevant institutions and organizations under the coordination of the GAP RDA.

GAP TEYAP has been/is being implemented in 3 stages.

Phase I - Education-Extension (2011-2013)

Phase II - Release Model (2014-2016)

Phase III - Sustainability (2017-2022)

72 projects were supported, including the year of 2022. 30 projects have been completed and 42 are still in progress within the scope of GAP TEYAP.

Implementation processes of ongoing projects are 2-3 years.









#### ORGANIC AGRICULTURE CLUSTER DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

Cluster development work to be carried out in the provinces of the Southeastern Anatolia Region in the field of organic agriculture, was put into practice in 2009 to be carried out in cooperation with the relevant institutions and organizations under the coordination of the GAP RDA, in order to evaluate the agricultural potentials of the Region and to bring the organic food, beverage and organic textile sectors to a more competitive position.

Priorities of GAP Organic Agriculture Cluster Development Project;

Priority 1: Encouraging organization in organic agricultural production and supporting institutionalization,

Priority 2: Increasing the added value and quality of organic agricultural products produced and/or processed in the Region,

Priority 3: Ensuring the access of organic products produced and/or processed in the Region to sustainable markets by developing regional, national and international collaborations.

60 projects were supported, including the year of 2022. 55 projects have been completed and 5 are in progress within the scope of the Organic Agriculture Cluster Development Project.









#### IMPACT ASSESSMENT OF IRRIGATION INVESTMENTS PROJECT

It is aimed to develop technical, economic and political tools related to irrigation investments and present them to decision makers.

- The project has started to be carried out in cooperation with Harran University, together with relevant institutions and organizations.

Phase 1 activities of the project were completed in December 2021, and Phase II started in January 2022.





#### GAP KÖSİP (GAP Region Small Scale Irrigation Works Sectoral Operational Program)

The general aim of the project is to increase the production capacity of the enterprises and the employability of the rural workforce, to increase the welfare level of the rural society by providing regular and sufficient income opportunities, to keep the population in the countryside and to contribute to food security, with the understanding of environmentally, socially and economically sustainable rural development.

Goals and expected outputs;

- Increasing irrigated agricultural lands outside the GAP Irrigation Project (GAP Action Plan) areas,
- Renovation of areas with very low irrigation efficiency in the current situation (increasing from 20-30% to 55%), which was done during the village services period,
- Ensuring the transition of idle irrigation areas, which need rehabilitation and modernization, to irrigated agriculture,
- Developing alternative production models (good agriculture, organic agriculture, greenhouse cultivation, etc.) in small-scale irrigable areas that can potentially create added value,
- Contribute to reducing the income gap between regions,
- Protecting agricultural resources and increasing their productivity,
- Contribution to employment is targeted.

Within the scope of GAP KÖSİP, which was included in the investment program for the first time in 2022, 4 projects were supported. All projects are still ongoing.











#### INTEGRATED RURAL DEVELOPMENT

- Sub-Regional Determination Strategic Plan was prepared
- Sustainability, participation, value chain analysis and clustering approaches were taken into account "Sub-Regional Rural Development Plans" in 28 districts
- Project implementation units were created
- ❖ For rural development; capacity building trainings, organization, marketing, development of agriculture and plant production, drinking water, rural tourism, increasing entrepreneurship and employment, projects for supporting social development
- ❖ A total of 340 sub-projects were implemented between 2011-2021.

#### GAP REGION TOURISM ORIENTED PROMOTION AND BRANDING PROJECT

In the GAP Region Tourism Master Plan, which was prepared by the GAP Administration in 2011; The "GAP Region Tourism-Focused Promotion and Branding Project" has been a long-term project since June 2014, in order to evaluate the cultural heritage of the region with a tourism focus by considering the protection-use balance, to increase employment and tourism revenues, and to ensure the continuity of tourism movements in a healthier and more sustainable way.

Our project aims to make an important sustainable tourism destination by branding the region covering 9 GAP provinces (Adıyaman, Batman, Diyarbakır, Gaziantep, Kilis, Mardin, Siirt, Şanlıurfa, Şırnak) with a holistic approach.





# STRENGTHENING THE GAP REGION'S TOURISM PHYSICAL INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECT

❖Tourism, which is an important part of economic development, plays an important role in reducing poverty by creating new employment areas, increasing the cultural and tourism-oriented income level of the Region, and forming the cultural and social structure. In order to increase the tourism-oriented employment and income of the region, 33 projects were supported between 2017 and 2021 to strengthen the physical infrastructure, and a total of 37,258,414 TL grant support was provided to these projects, which is making the region an important center of attraction in terms of tourism.



# KARAALI GEOTHERMAL WELL DRILLING AND ITS CONTRIBUTION TO THE ECONOMY PROJECT

With the project realized in order to protect the water level in the wells used for heating in the Karaali region, where greenhouse cultivation is carried out on an area of 500 decares;

- Drilling 2 geothermal production wells
- Construction of 4 reinjection wells
- ❖ After the incoming hot water is used in greenhouses, it is aimed to reuse the cooled water efficiently.

The project is supported with 1,195,000,00 TL.






